Reading	Phonics	Spelling		
<p>Keep on reading books you have at home and the ones you can access on your electronic devices e.g.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Oxford Owls free reading 'e-books'. The Biff, Chip and Kipper free stories on the kindle app. <p>Rory has just created a 'Reading Rocket' as an incentive to keep reading at home. Each time he reads, he moves his rocket up a rung and when he reaches the 'moon' he will receive a special treat!</p> <p>If you are struggling to get your child to continue reading at home, why not give this a go!</p>	<p>Mrs Wellum's group: Keep practising your Phase 5 sounds using your Phase 5 word mat (on the school website)</p> <p>This week can you focus on the alternative pronunciations of 'y' e.g. in the word 'yes' compared to the word 'why' and also where it makes more of an 'ee' sound at the end of words like 'happy'. See if you can make lists of words that show the different pronunciations.</p> <p>Mrs Lenton's group: Teach how to read two-syllable words containing adjacent consonants e.g. shampoo, giftbox, helpdesk, sandpit. Identify the capital letters. 	<p>Mrs Askwith's group: Practise your Phase 3 sounds (phase 3 mat in resources). This week can you practise the 'er' and 'air' sounds? What words can you find that have these sounds in them? Practise writing them.</p>	<p>Mrs Askwith's group were not on spellings just yet but if anyone fancies a challenge – have a go at these: her, now, jet, win, tax, vet</p>		
	<p>Maths</p> <p>All: Money</p> <p>We hope you are becoming more confident with money over the past few weeks. This week we would like you to do some practical work combining amounts to make some different values.</p>	<p>Topic (Where we live)</p> <p>Science - Materials</p> <p>Our science topic for the next few weeks will be all about materials.</p> <p>This week we will be focussing on the properties of materials. Can you investigate some materials around the house, feel them are they hard, soft, bendy, see-through?</p> <p><i>Task: Can you describe the materials by matching the describing words with the pictures on the sheet?</i></p>		

2. *Correct the sentences in the alien letter and as an extra challenge re-write it with the correct capital letters and full stops.*
3. *Write your own sentences using the pictures, using capital letters for people's names and places.*

If you don't have access to a printer you can view these on the computer and write them, or have a go at writing some sentences of your own about your family, using capital letters for their names. Don't forget to finish all your sentences with a full stop.

Task: We hope you have all received your letters in the post. If you haven't had chance yet, look for the features of a letter in this one, did Mrs Wellum include...

An address

A date

A greeting e.g. Dear, To..

An introduction

A conclusion

A closing remark e.g. from, followed by the senders name

PSHE/well-being

'Things to look forward to' jar:

With some things beginning to return to a new normal, why not make a list or some notes to put in a jar of all the things you and your family would like to do once it is safe to do so. Places you would like to visit, people you would like to see etc.

Task: Can you work with an adult to show and draw around coins that make these amounts:

3p, 4p, 6p, 9p, 11p, 15p

Then can you make your own snack shop by putting real or pretend foods on these labels and asking your family to be the customers? They must combine the coins to make these amounts and purchase the items. Make sure you swap over and get a chance to be the customer too!

Y1: Place Value

Task: Use the hundred square (in resources) to:

- *Count forwards from 80 to 92*
- *Count backwards from 73 to 65*
- *Write down the numbers between 75 and 81*
- *Find what number comes between 46 and 48*

Reception: Counting forwards and backwards to 20.

Task: Can you count to 20 forwards and backwards? Can you identify a missing number in a line of numbers between 0-20?


There are some resources in the folder with different levels of challenge – give them a go.
