<p>Keep on reading books you have at home and the ones you can access on your electronic devices e.g.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oxford Owls free reading 'e-books'. • The Biff, Chip and Kipper free stories on the kindle app. <p>When reading a book – try making a word catcher, this is two pieces of paper (as shown below in blue) – then when you have read a page, ask your child to catch a word by putting the paper pieces on either side of it e.g. "Can you catch the word said?"</p> <p>Yes you can  Floppy</p>	<p>Mrs Wellum's group: Keep practising your Phase 5 sounds using your Phase 5 word mat (on the school website)</p> <p>This week can you focus on the alternative pronunciations of 'a': firstly as in 'fat, cat' then as in 'acorn, bacon'. Make a list for each and see how many words you can think of.</p> <p>Mrs Lenton's group: Can you practise reading these phase 4 words: smell, sleep, groan, speak, float, swing.</p> <p>Can you make an 'I can' booklet by writing these words and drawing an accompanying picture e.g. I can swing (picture of you on a swing).</p>	<p>Practise them and ask a grown up to test you on Friday</p> <p>Mrs Lenton's phonics group spellings:</p> <p>some one said come do so</p> <p>Mrs Wellum's phonics group spellings:</p> <p>fair chair care spare square pear wear their cure pure</p>
<h3>Writing (including Punctuation & Grammar)</h3> <p>Our focus book for the next few weeks will be 'The Jolly Postman'. If you have this story, brilliant, if you don't then watch this video on YouTube of someone telling the story...</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CeTTqQoJ2Gw</p> <p>We would like you to become familiar with the story this week, so take some time to read or watch the video of the story a few times. Talk about the story with a grown up, and answer these questions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Who did Goldilocks write a letter to? 2. What kind of letter did the Wicked Witch receive? 3. Who sent a postcard? 4. What had the printing press made for Cinderella? 	<p>Mrs Askwith's group: Practise your Phase 3 sounds (phase 3 mat in resources). This week can you focus on 'igh', 'ur', and 'ow'. What words can you make with these sounds?</p>	<p>Mrs Askwith's group were not on spellings just yet but if anyone fancies a challenge – have a go at these: my, for, too, you, this, that</p>
	<h3>Maths</h3> <p>All: Money</p> <p>Money will be our focus topic for the next few weeks. It is a tricky one to understand but try your best.</p> <p><i>Task: Can you order some coins from 1p-£1. Draw around these coins and discuss their values.</i></p>	<h3>Topic (Where we live)</h3> <p>Science - Materials</p> <p>Our science topic for the next few weeks will be all about materials. There is a powerpoint in the resources section about materials if you would like to watch it.</p> <p><i>Task: Can you go around the house and make a list of all the different materials things are made from?</i></p>

SPAG

This week we would like you to focus on capital letters and full stops. Full stops mark the end of a sentence. Capital letters come at the start of a sentence, they can also be used for someone's name.

Task: Complete one of the 'full stops and capital letters' activity sheets in the resources section. There are different levels to choose from.

Y1: Multiplication and Division

Can you practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. Can you shade in with 3 different colours where the multiples of 2, 5 and 10 appear on a 100 square?

Reception: Number formation

Task: Can you practice writing your numbers from 0-20, focus on your number formations.
