Reading	Phonics	Spelling	
<p>Keep reading for at least 10 minutes every day. Read books, magazines, recipes etc. If you would like to access virtual books here are some good options...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Oxford Owls have free reading 'e-books'. Amazon Fire for kids – they have uploaded lots of Oxford reading tree books they can read on their tablet. <p>Don't forget the importance of being read to everyday – there are lots of authors reading their stories online at the moment, see who you can find on Youtube.</p> <p>Comprehension: Can you answer questions about the book? Maybe you could draw a picture of the setting? This means where the story took place. Could you spot rhyming words in a Julia Donaldson story, if you don't have one you can find them on Youtube. Our favourites are The Gruffalo, Stick Man and Zog.</p>	<p>Mrs Wellum's group: Keep practising your Phase 5 sounds using your Phase 5 word mat (on the school website) This week can you focus on the alternative pronunciation of 'u' e.g. under & unicorn and alternative pronunciation of the 'ow' sound e.g. low and cow.</p> <p>Mrs Lenton's group: As there are no new sounds in Phase 4, keep practising your Phase 3 sounds using your Phase 3 word mat. (on the school website) Can you practise writing these words and identify what Phase 3 sound is in them: paint, shelf, north, boost, think, greet. (you could stick them around the house, write them in mud, flour etc the possibilities are endless)</p>	<p>Practise them and ask a grown up to test you on Friday</p> <p>Mrs Lenton's phonics group spellings:</p> <p>Some One Said Come Do So Were</p>	<p>Mrs Wellum's phonics group spellings:</p> <p>burn turn sir bird herb stern learn heard worm worst</p>

We would love to see your poems – so please email them in to</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>Time focus: Can you use a stopwatch on a watch, ipad or phone and time yourself completing challenges e.g. how fast can you run down the garden and back, how fast can you put all the lego in the box etc. Estimate how long you think it will take to complete a task then time yourself and record your findings.</p>	<p>Topic (Where we live - UK)</p> <p>History</p> <p>Have you visited Glen Howe park before? What do you know about this park? Could you research the history behind it and make a poster?</p>


- How many cats are in this class?
