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
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Weekly Newsletter: 15th January 2024

Attendance

As you are aware, school has a responsibility to monitor the attendance of our pupils and keep you informed about this. There is an established link between school attendance and academic achievement - it is vital that children attend school as much as they possibly can (we understand some absences are unavoidable). During the autumn term, our overall attendance was 94.0%. This was an improvement on this time last year and above the National Average. However, we would like this figure to be at least 95%...



Term Dates

Linked to this, it is important to take holidays outside of school time wherever possible. You have this week been sent our confirmed term dates for the next academic year (2024-25) - paper copies are available from reception on request. The dates are set by Sheffield City Council but the school / Trust set the INSET days. Children will return to school on Thursday 5th September (don't worry – we will remind you closer to the time!).



School Meals & packed lunches

If your child is in Y3 – Y6 and you pay for dinners, please log on to sQuid and check the balance in your 'purse'. School meals cost £2.50 per day and we cannot allow families to get into debt over this. Meanwhile, if you send your child with a packed lunch, please remember we are a NUT FREE school. We have staff and children with serious allergies and we cannot risk having nuts (or products containing nuts like Nutella) in school... Thank you!
