



The Children's Commissioner for England has recently launched 'The Big Ambition' to hear directly from children, young people, and parents across the country. The survey will be used to encourage policymakers to think about children and young people's needs, to ensure children's voices are reflected in the decisions that will affect them in years to come.

Vaccinations

- Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting school in England at risk of catching the disease. Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated, 9/10 children in a classroom can catch the disease if just 1 child is infectious. Please read the NHS Back to School guidance here and consider getting the MMR vaccination if you haven't already.
- Meanwhile, we will be offering the annual flu vaccination in school towards the end of this month (more information to come).

October Half-Term

October half-term is fast approaching. A few notes / reminders:

- We break up on Thursday 19th October (school is closed on Friday 20th for an INSET Day) and return on Monday 30th October. Our first Parents' Evening of the year will take place on Wednesday 1st November (letter with booking instructions to come this week).
- Our after-school providers 'Kids Love Yoga' are running a Half-Term Yoga Camp for children age 4-10. This is based in Meersbrook and takes place on 4 days during the holiday (9am-3:30pm). It costs £25-£30 per day (with a 10% sibling discount using the code SIBLING10). Find out more or book here.
