#### School Milk for Spring 2 (24th February – 24th March)

- School milk for the second half of the SPRING TERM 2025 (24<sup>th</sup> February 24<sup>th</sup> March) will be £6 in total. If you would like your child to have this, please go to the offer on sQuid.
- If your child has Means Tested Free School Meals, this is free of charge but still needs to be ordered through the appropriate offer on sQuid.
- Children under 5 years old (ASH) receive free school milk, but this also needs to be ordered; it will not be done automatically. Please look for the appropriate sQuid offers to order (you can ignore this if your child is in Nursery because milk has already been ordered).
- PLEASE PLACE ORDERS BY TUESDAY 11<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2025.

#### School dinners, sQuid and holiday food

- If you pay for your child's lunches at school, can we please request that you keep on top of the cost and ensure any **balances are cleared ASAP**? We do try to remind individual parents about this but it is ultimately your responsibility... If balances are not cleared; we may not be able to provide additional lunches for your child in the future.
- Linked to this, we have been informed that **sQuid** will no longer be providing services to schools soon. With this in mind, the Trust are looking into alternative providers and we will communicate any changes with you as soon as possible. We are hoping for a seamless transition to the new company and we will hopefully iron out some of the difficulties that people have experienced with the system. Thank you for your patience in this matter!
- Meanwhile, Sheffield City Council have once again confirmed that they will be providing **food vouchers** for families on free school meals during half-term. These will be distributed in the usual way and codes should be with you at some point this week. If you are expecting one and don't receive it, please let us know on Thursday or Friday.
- We all like a treat from time to time but eating out can be expensive. A huge number of pubs, restaurants and cafes (from Asda to Zizzi) have recognised this and will be providing special offers for ALL families during half-term.
