Lockdown procedures

As you know, we did a 'lockdown' practice with the children before the holiday. This was observed by one of our governors, David Chinchen, and the children were VERY sensible throughout. They understood the need to practice (in the same way as we do a fire drill) and remained calm / quiet. We were very proud of them!

Attendance

Our whole-school attendance for the year-to-date is **95.4%.** This is up on this time last year and above the latest National Average (94.8% for Primary Schools). We are of course happy with this but it is still short of our target of **97%.** Obviously, we don't want children to come in if they are likely to spread a virus; but please continue to do what you can to maximise their attendance (every day counts!). Examples of this include not taking holidays in term-time and booking and booking routine appointments after school wherever possible. Thank you for your support in this matter.
