Phonics success!

Our Y1 children completed the '**Phonics Screening Check**' earlier in June and we are now in a position to share the results... We are delighted to reveal that **88.2%** of our children achieved the pass mark of at least 32/40 – this is well above last year's National Average (80.5%) and also higher than the Peak Edge Trust average.
