Parent Pay

We have been made aware that many parents are having an issue with Parent Pay. Whilst it is allowing you to log-in through Reach More and deposit funds for dinners etc, it is not necessarily updating your balance when meals are ordered. We are working with the developers to try and fix this issue... They have suggested that parents could try logging in to Parent Pay separately (i.e. not through the app) using the same email you use for Reach More – thus enabling the system to properly 'link' the two accounts. You should hopefully have received an email on Friday advising how to do this. I hope this helps!

Suncream

We were pleased to see some sun last week (where did it go?) and it reminded me to mention something about suncream in school... On particularly hot days, it is a good idea apply suncream to protect children from the heat. Staff cannot do this so please do it in the morning before they come to school (the majority of children's suncreams last up to 24 hours so one application should be sufficient). We would also encourage the use of hats when playing outside but we do limit their time in the sun and encourage them to access the shade.
