SATs results

We received our Y6 SATs results on Tuesday and we were very proud of what the children have achieved. This includes the fact that 39% of the cohort achieved 'Greater Depth' in reading (this figure is 50% if you count only the children that were able to access the test). The children have been given their scores today and an official report card will come out tomorrow.
